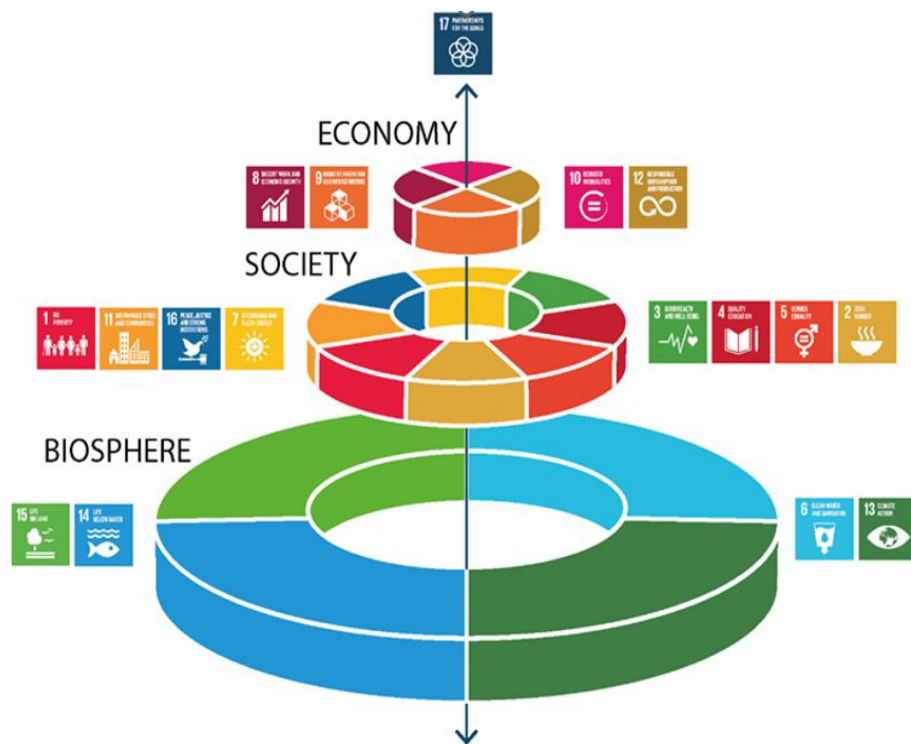

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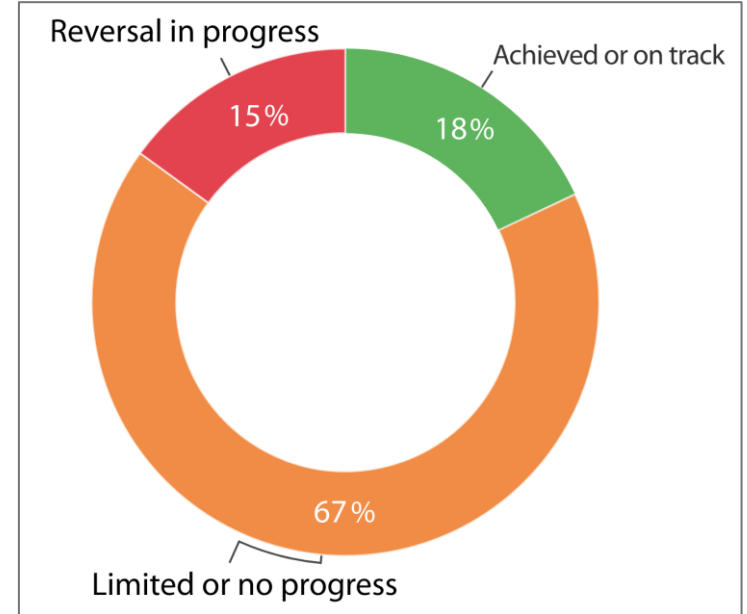

# The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development



- Formally adopted in 2015
- Establishes the **17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**
- Establishes a **follow-up and review mechanism: VNRs**

# Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)



- Most SDGs not on track
- Annual SDG funding gap is growing

## Why evaluate the SDGs?

- Since the adoption of the 2030 Agenda in 2015, countries around the world have rallied to **include the SDGs in their national development planning**.
- Despite these efforts, this approach has not been operationalized in the guidance, discussion, statements and analysis of **VNRs**.
- VNR reporting is heavily **centered on monitoring**, with very little relation or reference to evaluation.

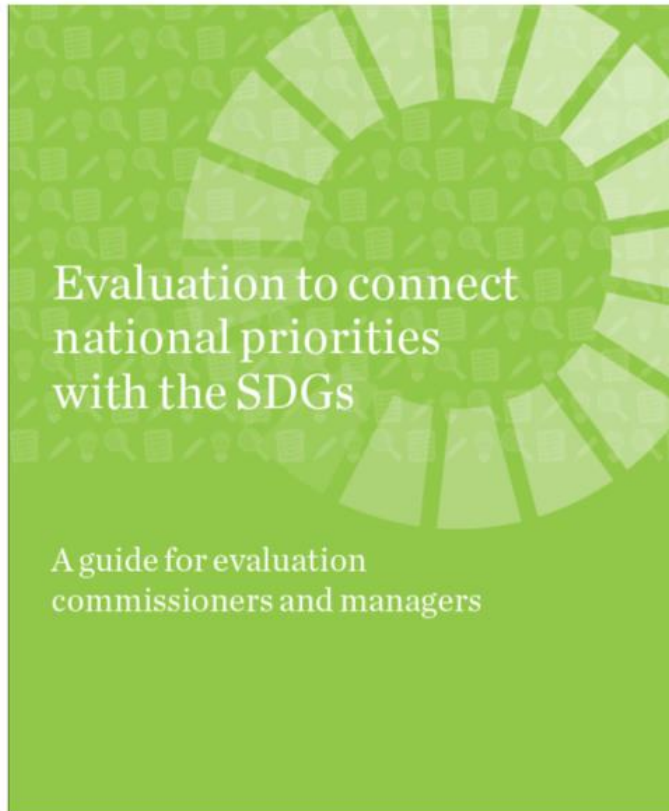
## UN Resolution 77/283

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### “Strengthening Voluntary National Reviews through Country-led Evaluation”

- *Encourages* all Member States to present regular Voluntary National Reviews with a Country-led Evaluation component (...)
- *Encourages* all Member States to use evidence from evaluations of the Sustainable Development Goals implementation for decision-making and reporting on their progress towards achieving the 2030 Agenda (...)
- *Requests* the United Nations agencies (...) to provide support at the request of Member States on their efforts to undertake evaluations of the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (...)

# SDG evaluation guide book



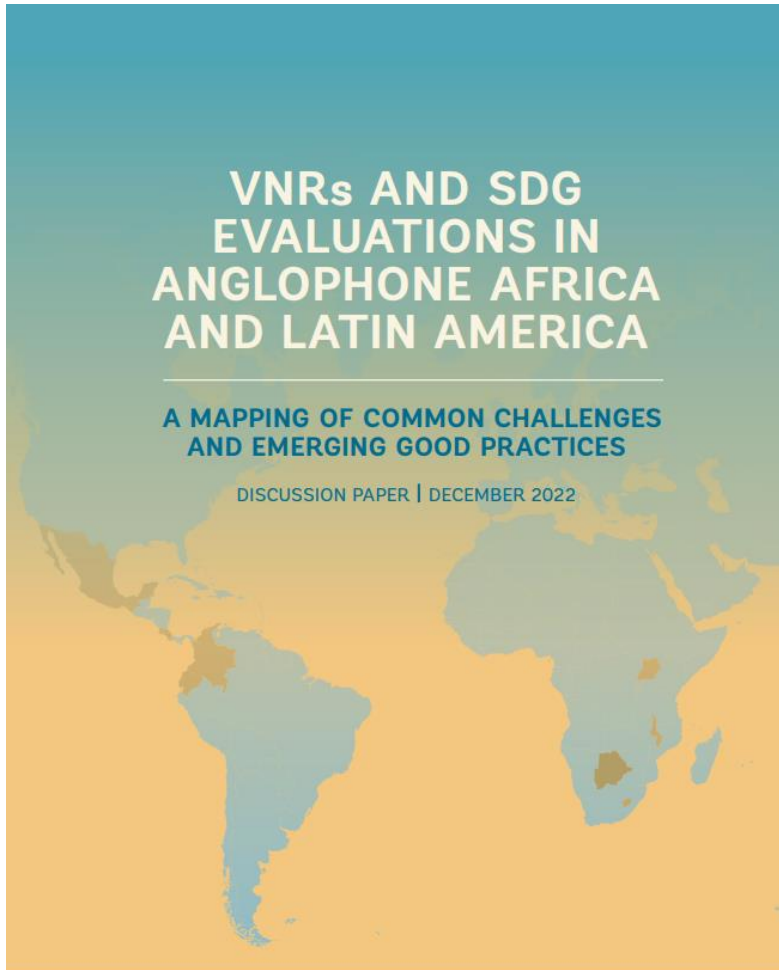
- Informed by emerging national practice (Finland, Nigeria, Costa Rica)

# VNRs and Country-led SDG Evaluations

VNRs	Country-led Evaluations
<b>Measure and report on national progress towards achieving the SDGs</b>	Explain the targets and progress and support decisions, by addressing the complexity of the SDGs and their achievement, in relation to national policies and programmes
Track ongoing progress in programme implementation in outputs and in outcomes	Make use of VNR monitoring data but are primarily concerned with how well implementation, outputs and development outcomes were achieved, as well as with determining long-term development impact
<b>Report on indicators against targets</b>	<b>Examine and help answer ‘why’ targets are achieved (or not achieved)</b>
Driven by accountability to achieve the SDG targets	Driven by evaluative thinking and hence balance accountability with learning aspects to inform policy choices and influence programmes
Engage a variety of stakeholders at all levels	



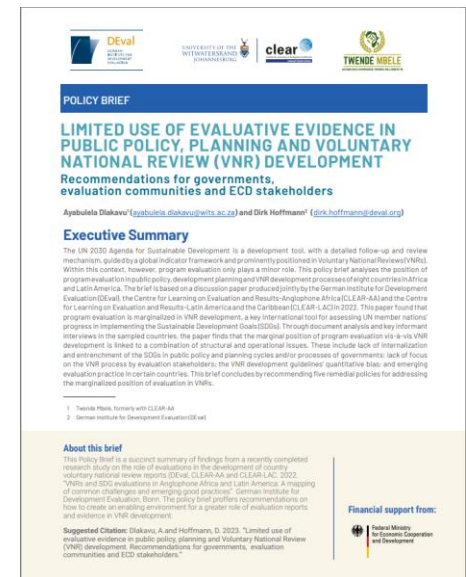

## Contents and use of the study

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- Assessment of the use of **SDG evaluation evidence** when measuring progress made by African and Latin American countries *vis-à-vis* achieving the 17 SDGs.
- Identification of **emerging lessons and good practices** in AA and LAC.
- **Presentation of the findings** of our research to VNR stakeholders, policymakers, evaluators and evaluation advocacy stakeholders.



## Conclusions of the study

While all countries mapped for this analysis have integrated the SDGs in their **national planning**, only limited progress has been made to ensure that SDGs are taken as key references for sector-level planning.



There is a profound need to raise awareness as well as a common language on what SDG evaluation entails since there is a concentration of efforts on data-driven monitoring of the SDGs that has led to a shortage of time and resources to invest in building the necessary conceptual and methodological ground for SDG evaluation.



# Policy recommendations

- 1. For governments:** Integrate the SDGs and their indicators into public policymaking and planning systems.
- 2. For parliaments:** Enact legislation or regulations that promote the mandatory evaluation of public policies and development plans.
- 3. Evaluation stakeholders** should advocate for greater participation in VNR development processes.
- 4. The UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA)** should update the VNR development guidelines.
- 5. ECD institutions and development partners** should augment their capacity building activities.





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
